Dennis was born in Stoke Newington, London on November 1st 1926. His father was an actor and made 13 full length silent films in the 1920's; his mother a musical comedy soprano.

Dennis grew up in Cheshire. He volunteered for the Royal Air Force and was accepted but later discharged suffering from a kidney disease. Some months later he joined the Royal Observer Corps and served until 1961 being awarded the Long Service Medal and retired in the rank of Leading Observer has since become a recognised authority and historian on the ROC, particularly 19 Group and its thirty-eight posts that protected London. Has appeared in TV documentaries including Granada's *Battlefield Detectives* and ITV's *David Jason's Battle of Britain*.
